About Klukwan Salmon Camp:

The Klukwan Traditional Knowledge Camp is a part of the Jilkaat Kwaan Heritage Center and is located on the east end of Klukwan, at 22 mile on the Haines Highway. The camp includes instruction in Tlingit language, traditional food processing, i.e. dry fish, naayadi (half-dried salmon on the skin), brine smoked salmon, and pressure processing using the latest safety guidelines published by the University of Alaska Fairbanks, Cooperative Extension Service.

Participants should plan on arriving in Klukwan on the day before camp begins as we plan to start at 9:00 am on the first day of camp. Plans for departure should be made for the evening of the last day of camp or the morning following. Participants should bring/wear casual clothing that can be layered: example t-shirts with a hoodie sweatshirt or other warm sweater, and a raincoat or poncho. Bring rubber boots, sneakers, your own toiletries—soap, toothpaste, shampoo, towels, etc. We also recommend that you bring your own bug spray.

The camp is family oriented so there will be people of all ages participating. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. We look forward to meeting you and hope that you will have an enjoyable stay here in Klukwan.
